

Larkspur NA Board Meeting Minutes  
September 14, 2010, 6:30pm—7:30pm

6:30pm Roll call: Diane, Tania, Matt, Misa. Call to order, approval of June and Aug general meeting minutes.

Visitors: City Council seat candidates: Mark Moseley, with his wife Trish and Scott Ramsay sat in the meeting.

6:35pm Treasurer's report

- No purchases have been made in the past two months.

6:40pm Committee reports:

- Land Use:
  - Lava Lanes wants to sell alcohol for off-site consumption. No response from the ' to Misa's letter.
  - Application for an additional cell tower on Reed Market road where an existing tower already stands. Existing ATT tower is 110' high. Verizon would like to place a 64' tower next to the existing one. That's ok by us.
  - City planning commission will be revising cell tower codes soon.
- Transportation:
  - Tempest/Larkspur Trail crossing is completed.
- Membership:
  - Will wait until next month to purchase Constant Contact software.
- Website:
  - Misa is looking at different web design software.
- Larkspur Trail:
  - Trail resurfacing with crushed rock has been ongoing.
- Parks:
  - Play area is under construction at Pilot Butte.

Miscellaneous:

- Commission for Children and Families is looking for board members. It is a citizen organization that makes recommendations to the county regarding the safety and welfare of children and families. Cannot be employed in an occupation that works directly with children or families.
- LNA referred I heart Central Oregon, a service of Father's House Church on Pettigrew, to Bear Creek School to coordinate lands clean up for a day of community service on Sept 25.
- Misa will attend the citizens police academy.

- The Oct and Nov meetings will be held on either the second Monday or second Wed those months because of scheduling conflict with Diane. Dates TBA.
- City council candidates Mark Moseley and Scott Ramsay asked how the council might be of assistance to LNA and NA's in general

Matt and Misa expressed LNA's major concerns:

1. The need to service our neighbors, who tend to walk a lot, with more pedestrian friendly routes. Particularly from 15<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> on both Bear Creek and Reed Market Rds. which could use both sidewalks and traffic calming devices. Ramsey noted the state budget shortfall and seemed to infer that this issue will not be address in the near future.
2. The last big piece of land that will be developed in our neighborhood is the 35-acre piece on 15<sup>th</sup>/Wilson. The developers would like zone changes to the property before they detail exactly what they want to put in those changes. This seems a little backwards.
3. Mosely asked what the council could do for us. A more streamline method of communication with NAs would be very helpful. Right now we have to do a lot of leg work to help answer neighbor's questions. Often we receive untimely replies or none at all from various city departments.
